Professor Robert Allison became Vice-Chancellor & President of Loughborough University in 2012. Previously he was Deputy Vice-Chancellor and Pro-Vice-Chancellor at Sussex University, Dean of Social Sciences of Health and Head of Geography at Durham University.

Professor Allison contributes to organisations including the Natural Environment Research Council, Higher Education Funding Council for England, the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy and Universities UK.

Professor Allison has awards for his research and teaching including the Cuthbert Peek Award (Royal Geographical Society), Charles Lyell Award (British Association for the Advancement of Science) and the Jan De Ploey Prize (International Association of Geomorphologists).
