# 4. Thinking together about theory in SaP event

Come along to the 2021 Higher Education Research and Development Society of Australasia (HERDSA) Conference workshop and talk theory. Join the pre-conference workshop, *The scholarship of engaging students as partners in learning and teaching: Thinking together at the intersection of theory and practice*. The workshop will create space for scholars to dialogue about key research that is moving us closer toward theories of partnership praxis. In doing so, we will dig deeply into existing theorisations or interpretative frames that colour how we research partnership practices while unearthing new theories and frames to provoke new insights and avenues of inquiry.   Issue 5.1 of the International Journal for Students as Partners (IJSaP) is now available. In the issue, you will find an editorial, an opinion piece, 3 research articles, 3 reflective essays, 4 case studies, the first set of contributions to the 'Voices from the Field', and a book review. Together these contributions have been written by 42 faculty/staff and 29 students from 11 different countries (Australia, Canada, China (Hong Kong), China (Mainland), Malaysia, UK, US, Germany, Ireland, Saudi Arabia, and Papua New Guinea).

- **Reviews:** Include reviews of a book, conference/symposium, or resources that both summarise and provide insight specific to Students as Partners (no more than 800 words).
