ITaLI is an integrated teaching, research and service delivery centre for teaching and learning practices at UQ. ITaLI seeks to establish and maintain a flexible operating structure to drive and support innovation and excellence for these activities.

Under the Leadership of the Director, ITaLI provides leadership, engagement and advocacy in educational innovation, teaching excellence and learning analytics, and aims to transform teaching and learning across the University through the delivery of faculty and executive prioritised, teaching and learning projects and services. ITaLI addresses critical areas of unmet need in teaching and learning by bridging the gap between the exponentially expanding discipline of higher education teaching and the increasing complexity of teaching to assist University teaching staff and improve the learning experience of students.

#### **DUTY STATEMENT**

The Affiliate Academic is a School/Faculty-based outreach role offered by ITaLI and is open to UQ academic staff who are currently appointed at level A - E and can demonstrate current and/or developing expertise in the advancement of teaching and learning.

This honorary academic role represents a key contribution to Service within the University and will enable the position holder to develop their teaching and leadership capabilities in the context of the UQ teaching and learning portfolio.

As an established or emerging educational champion in their discipline, the Affiliate Academic will work with ITaLI staff to build and share expertise to inform new and existing teaching and learning projects and processes. A member of staff may undertake the role with the goal of developing their own capability in a particular area by receiving mentorship from ITaLI experts and School leaders. Affiliates with a higher-level academic appointment will be expected to provide guidance back to their colleagues through coaching and mentoring of academic and professional staff. Support to academics in the Schools and Faculties may include formal workshops, one-on-one or small group bespoke sessions, and/or contribution to the development of resources.

Affiliate Academics provide a conduit between Schools and ITaLI by actively promoting teaching and learning initiatives within their business unit and teaching teams and enabling cross-unit communication to help build teaching capability across UQ.

The work of the Affiliate must be consistent with the <u>UQ Strategic Plan</u>, <u>Teaching and Learning Plan</u>, and <u>Higher Education Learning Framework</u>.

Affiliate positions are currently available in the following areas:

- Assessment
- Academic Integrity
- Curriculum Design
- Data Analytics
- Digital and Blended Learning
- Entrepreneurship
- Indigenising the Curriculum
- Learning Analytics
- Peer Observation
- other nominated new or emerging areas of interest

#### It is anticipated that an Affiliate Academic will:

- be a current HEA Fellow or develop an application to become an HEA fellow during the term of their Affiliate appointment;
- meet with their ITaLI academic supervisor every 2 months;
- deliver Teaching & Learning-focused seminar/workshop to their School;
- participate in the annual ITaLI Affiliate workshop:
- contribute and/or lead occasional papers on their area of interest as relevant to the future direction of UQ;
- have, or be interested in developing, a scholarship of teaching and learning profile; and
- compile a brief annual report of activities performed in their Affiliate role.

### Other

- Ensure you are aware of and comply with legislation and University policy relevant to the duties undertaken, including but not exclusive to:

  - requirements of the Queensland occupational health and safety (OH&S) legislation and related OH&S responsibilities and procedures developed by the University or Institute/School

### **Organisational Relationships**

The position reports to a designated ITaLI Academic.

#### Time commitment

1 day per fortnight or equivalent. An Affiliate Academic may be appointed, in consultation with their supervisor, for a term of 2 years, with the option to extend/renew the appointment.

#### Remuneration

This is an academic service role and therefore does not attract remuneration.

#### SELECTION CRITERIA

A successful Affiliate will hold either a fixed-term or continuing academic position at Level A-E and be able to:

- evidence expertise or developing expertise in teaching and learning
- demonstrate a capacity to innovate within their teaching and learning portfolio
- have a strong interest and capability in their area of focus

Personal qualities will include excellent communication skills, a collaborative spirit and a commitment to the excellence and advancement of teaching and learning at UQ.

Support from the academic's Head of School is required.

## **Expression of Interest Process**

An academic staff member may apply for an Affiliate position at any time during the year via a one-page expression of interest (EOI) outlining the area of interest, anticipated contributions, track record of success and a short CV. However, they are encouraged to meet with the ITaLI Director in the first instance and discuss their EOI with their HOS.

Applicants will be invited to attend an informal meeting to discuss their EOI submission with the ITaLI Director and an ITaLI Academic relevant to the nominated area of interest.
