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Hands-on experience

Students in all fields are looking for practical assessment tasks with realworld application.

"More flexible and practical assessments **instead of traditional exams** ... would help us think critically instead of just following a system."

Interdisciplinary content

Students feel that they are not prepared to work overseas, and don't know how to work with professionals from other industries.

"They need to provide **more incentives and opportunities** to take diverse classes and subjects."



Group work

Many students are asking to be assigned a study group, and also want to complete assessments as group tasks.

"I think the university should include more group assessment tasks so we can get a better idea of what it's like to work in teams, **especially in a workplace setting.**"

Industry networking

Students want more opportunities to network with their peers, and with professionals in their field.

"[Networking events] provide a lot of opportunities for students to connect, leam from others, and apply what we've leamed in class to real-world conversations and settings."
